It is a pleasure to present this exhibition, which we have put together with a special purpose: to bring beauty and tranquility and the excitement of artful expression to you during these trying times.

The evolution of Japanese aesthetics is heavily influenced by the development of Chanoyu or Tea Ceremony, which arose in Japan during a time of great conflict and cultural upheaval. Samurai and administrative leaders were buffeted by forces that seemed beyond control. At any moment they might be called to their deaths. In this precarious environment they sought moments of peace and reflection and they found both in the Way of Tea. In the Tea ritual and in the connoisseurship and the contemplation of beautiful and symbolic objects they found release from their worldly concerns.

The aesthetics of Tea have persisted in Japanese culture. The humble is elevated. Simplicity, even roughness, are celebrated. Beauty is found in both perfection and imperfection. Today, useful wares, such as quinomi (sake cup) and Yunomi (drinking cup) are carefully considered in terms of form and function. The wide mouth of a sake cup brings more aroma to the nose. Cold sake calls for thin porcelain; thick yakishime is the choice for warm sake. Some collectors choose to focus on guinomi, and Yunomi which are affordable, easy to store and bring artfulness to the everyday.



From our home and our hearts to you: Stay blessed and stay healthy.






